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NPDES APPLICATION FOR REVIEW (Must also include E&SPC Plan Review items as well as the following)

General Permit: \$500.00 admin fee, Notice of Intent forms and all completed checklists, flowcharts and worksheets

Individual Permit: \$500.00 admin fee, General Permit information AND Completed General Information Form

The Conservation District will review this plan solely to determine whether it is adequate to satisfy the requirements of PA Code Title 25, Chapter 102, *Erosion and Sediment Control*. By a determination that the plan is adequate to meet those requirements, neither the District nor Lebanon County assumes any responsibility for the implementation of the plan or the proper construction and operation of the facilities contained within the plan. The design, structure, integrity, and installation of the control measures are the responsibility of the landowner and/or operator. Before any earth disturbance may begin, the appropriate and necessary local, state, and federal permits must be secured from the agencies having specific permitting authority. For sites with proposed earth disturbance activities of 1.0 acre or greater, and having a point source discharge to surface waters of the Commonwealth, no earth disturbance may take place and no building permits shall be issued until the applicant receives a written letter of plan adequacy from the Lebanon County Conservation District.

The District encourages pre-planning meetings, especially for challenging or unusual sites. There are no additional fees associated with such meetings.

STATEMENT OF POLICY

- All sites with 1.0 acre or greater of contiguous disturbed ground during the life of the project are required by law to comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitting guidelines. All applications for NPDES permits processed by the District will require a review of the E&SPC plan.
- The above fee schedule reflects an initial review and one resubmittal. Resubmittals made after 90 days from the date of the District review letter will again be subject to the appropriate review fee. If after a second review, the plan is found to be inadequate, the third submission is subject to a charge of 50% of the original fee. If after the third submission the plan is inadequate, the application will be declared null and void, and the applicant will be required to reapply and pay all corresponding review fees.
- Any revisions of the submission after the District has determined the submission to be adequate will negate the previous approval and the applicant will have to reapply and submit all corresponding review fees.
- The District reserves the right to modify fees on a case-by-case basis if earth disturbance activities are minimal.

NPDES PERMITTING PROCESS FOR CONSTRUCTION SITES DISTURBING 1.0 ACRE OR GREATER

GENERAL NPDES PERMIT (\$500.00 administrative fee)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The project disturbs 5.0 or more acres in a watershed not protected by High Quality (HQ) or Exceptional Value (EV) status The project disturbs 1.0 to 4.9 acres and has a point source discharge to surface waters of the Commonwealth
INDIVIDUAL NPDES PERMIT (\$500.00 administrative fee)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The project is in a special protection HQ or EV watershed The construction activities discharge toxins The construction activities will violate water quality standards The construction activities are in areas inhabited by Federal or State Endangered Species

GENERAL PERMIT: The District reviews the E&SPC plan for adequacy. Once adequate, the District issues approval for permit use.

INDIVIDUAL PERMIT: The District reviews the E&SPC plan and additional Best Management Practice considerations for water quality protection in HQ or EV watersheds. After District review is complete, recommendation for permit action is sent to the DEP's southcentral regional office for final processing. Before a permit is issued, an application must be published in the PA Bulletin for public review.
